Environmental Policy

The management and all who work at Perfection Spring and Stamping Corp. are committed to the care of the environment and the prevention of pollution.

The organization ensures that all its activities are carried out in conformance with the relative environmental legislation and the code of practice issued by the Spring Manufactures Institute., Precision Metal Forming Association, Chicago Area Spring Manufactures Institute, and the National Association of Manufacturers.

The organization operates processes which are prescribed under the U.S. Environmental Protection Act 1990: Part one (Or Pollution Prevention and Control Act 1999), and observes the requirements laid down by the Cook County Counsel of the State of Illinois and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

The organization seeks to minimize waste, promote recycling, reduce energy consumption, reduce harmful emissions and, where possible, to work with suppliers who themselves have sound environmental policies.

As essential feature of the environmental management system is a commitment to improving environmental performance. The objectives and targets are publicized throughout the organization and all staff are committed to their achievement.

In order to ensure the achievement of the above commitments, the organization has implemented an environmental management system which satisfies the requirements of ISO 14001: 1996.
